Course Description

This Zoom class builds off of the podcast series called: "PodClass: What's the Word?" going into greater detail with classroom lectures and class discussion to answer theological questions about the Bible such as: "Who wrote the Bible?" "How do we interpret it?" "When did it become an actual book?" "Why do we have so many translations?" and "What can we do with all of those translations in our personal study of the Bible?" There are no mandatory assignments in the class, however students would benefit from listening to the required podcasts before each class.

Purpose of / Reason for the Course

Provide an opportunity for deeper learning through Christian continuing education on the theology and history of the Bible. Help develop the student's confidence in their understanding of what scripture is (and is not) and where it came from.

Course Objectives

- 1.) Create Christian continuing education for the listener.
- 2.) Build up the student's faith through theological inquiry into the Bible, presented in an accessible community college level classroom.
- 3.) Be able to distinguish various theologies and wrestle with them, to the end of working out one's own beliefs.
- 4.) Developing a charitable theology, where we can appreciate theological views that are ot our own, not demonizing the other, while having a strengthened awareness of the student's own belief system.
